

EVIDENCE OF TEACHING EFFECTIVENESS

PART I. FORMAL TEACHING EVALUATIONS

Syracuse University collects both qualitative and quantitative data from students for each course. Below I have listed some examples of student responses in courses that I have led as primary instructor. For each of these courses, I was solely responsible for course design and instruction. I am happy to provide the official documents upon request.

QUANTITATIVE DATA

Students are asked to express how strongly they agree with a series of statements, on a numeric scale as indicated. This section includes median and mean scores from a representative sample of these questions, for each of the courses I have taught synchronously and independently.

QUALITATIVE DATA

In this section I have included a representative selection of student comments from courses I have taught independently. These comments are reproduced verbatim with one exception: in some comments I have replaced instances of my deadname with my preferred name, and have corrected pronoun use.

- + Amazing professor, great course content, great teaching skills.
- + The instructor is both funny and good at teaching. I really enjoy attending to their class.
- + The most valuable aspect of this course for me was becoming more aware to what feminism is and how it affects everyone not just women. I also feel [Rowan] was a great teacher and was extremely passionate about [their] work which made me want to come to class and more eager to learn. [Rowan] really wants you to do well and succeed in [their] course and would give you all the extra help and guidance one needed whether it was to better understand an assignment or simply course material.
- + The flexibility this professor showed their students regarding deadlines communicated to me that they genuinely cared that we were turning in our best work and emphasizing course content over grading. This really gave me a positive learning experience and allowed me to focus on the material rather than worrying about grades.
- + The group activities and discussions that Professor Bell included in the curriculum were incredibly valuable to me b/c it gave context to what we were learning and gave everyone in our class the chance to participate.
- + The professor was always available for help outside the classroom.
- + The presentations really helped me understand the complex readings in a way I could then explain to others.
- + Professor Bell was great. They kept the class interesting with group activities and made lectures fun by getting the entire class involved.
- + I like that [Rowan] gave us readings that may have had conflicting view points so that we had to think critically for ourselves. I also liked that our papers all work sequentially to build skills that eventually lead to our final paper which was more of philosophical paper of our own.
- + This course challenged me to think about things that are not usually challenged by women in society.
- + Expectations were clearly expressed and class time promoted participation exceptionally well.
- + I loved when we had group discussions, had people come to speak to us, and when we went over powerpoints in class. I feel as though all of these helped facilitate my learning experience.
- + Professor Bell was passionate about open class discussions in class, so I was able to learn how to think critically through several "lenses," as each student contributed their own ideas and perspectives in relation to our assigned readings.

- + I found the "The Erasure of Black Women" to be one of the best readings for me. Being a white woman, I hadn't thought about how different a Black woman's struggles were to mine. I knew that the differences were there I just hadn't put in the effort to understand them better. This reading helped me the most in opening my eyes to how important intersectionality is and why it's so relevant in today's world, in the case of Black women, as well as other intersecting oppressions.
- + Learning to think about real world problems in a philosophical sense gave me a new perspective on certain issues I face in my everyday life.
- + [Rowan] is such an understanding, kind, and woke person. From the beginning of the semester, they were transparent and real about issues going on on campus and off. They are enlightening and I looked forward to go to class.
- + I wish the class had been longer so we had more time to discuss the materials.
